Each of the attitudes will bring you under the motivation of the spirit of the world (*Ephesians 2:2*).

- A) Idolatry. You prefer and love the world more than God. Your heart possesses the wrong treasures and your mind is being conformed to this present world. (*Matthew 16:25-26*)
- B) Jesus is not Lord of your life. You think Christianity is a religion rather than a way of life. Jesus is not to be added to your life, but be the very source of your life. (*John 14:6*)
- C) You have a high opinion of who you think you are. You feel you deserve a certain amount of attention or recognition. Your problem is pride. You are maintaining some kind of right to justify your unrighteous attitude. And, out of your pride will come jealousies, insecurities, anger, bitterness, resentment, unforgiveness and hatred. (*Matthew 6:15; Romans 12:3; Hebrews 12:15; James 3:13-17; 1 John 2:9-11*)
- D) You have no fear of the Lord; therefore, you are walking in the foolishness of rebellion and delusion. You will continue to make the wrong decisions because you will not recognize God's authority in your life. As a result, God will not be able to bless you, and you will continue to make the wrong decisions. (*Psalms 111:10; Hebrews 12:28-29*)
