LESSON #32**EXODUS 32:15-35**

Today we see artists' drawings of the tablets with the Ten Commandments written on them, so when we read about them in the Bible, we assume that is what they looked like. However, archaeologists have discovered many ancient clay "tablets" with inscriptions engraved on them, and they are quite small, about the size of a baseball. The tablets that God wrote on which Moses carried down the mountain "in his hand" were probably much smaller than we picture them.
